## HOSTS, VISITORS EACH WIN TWO IN OPENING LEAGUE PLAY

Friday, January 7<sup>th</sup> saw the opening of FSL play for all eight teams. Host Germantown beat Westtown 58-50, while Friends' Central won at home over Moorestown 60-34. Visiting Abington topped Select 68-45 and George proved to be an unwelcome guest at ANC, prevailing 57-37 over the host Lions. Germantown stretched a 7-point halftime lead to 11 after three periods on the way to their 8-point win. Leading the Tigers were junior Chris Hamilton with 17 points and senior Brandon Jones with 14. The Tigers helped their cause by going 9-10 from the charity stripe. Westtown was led by sophomores Dave Whartnaby and Ethan Wells with 21 and 15 points respectively. Whartnaby was a remarkable 17-19 from the free throw line. George School outscored ANC 30-11 in the second half to pull away from a 1-point half time lead. The Cougars were paced by seniors Jamal Mobley with 19 (5 threes) and Mario Anton with 14. Glen Herder and Drew Synnestvedt each had 11 for the Lions. Senior Ben Slater netted 21 for the Kangaroos of Abington, while junior Seth Taft added 12 in their win over Select. Junior Cliff Bell led the Falcons with 10 points. Friends' Central recovered from a 14-8 first quarter deficit to outscore Moorestown 35-8 in the middle two quarters on the way to their 26 point win. The Phoenix were led by sophomore Mike Cook with 20 points and senior Ryan Tozer with 13. Senior Jackiem Wright led the Foxes with 20 points (5 threes), while Adam Briggs added 11.

## 'ROOS REMAIN UNBEATEN; TIGERS GO OVERTIME TWICE

On Tuesday, January 11<sup>th</sup> George hosted Moorestown and took home a 53-47 win. The Cougars were paced by three players with double figures. Justin Smith had 13 points, while Gerard Best netted 12 and Mario Anton added 11. The Foxes were led by Jackiem Wright with 28 points while Adam Briggs added 11. On Friday, January 14<sup>th</sup> all 8 teams played with the visitors winning three of the four games. Abington topped Moorestown 69-46, led by Ben Slater with 26 points and aided by the balance of six players between 5 and 8 points. Wright again led the Foxes with 23 points (including 6-threes). Aaron Washington added 11. Friends Select pulled away from a 3-point halftime lead to beat visiting George School 65-56. The Falcons had three double-figure scorers. Ryan Schloss led the way with 21, followed by Chris Arlene with 14 and Khalief Walker with 12. Jamaal Mobley led the Cougars with 19, while Best added 15. Westtown outscored host ANC 21-13 in the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter to pull away from a 39-39 tie and top the Lions 60-52. Dave Whartnaby paced the winners with 17 points, while Ethan Wells added 14 and Dean McClain contributed 11. Glenn Herder paced the hosts with 20 points, aided by Derek Glunz with 14 and Kevin Junge with 12. In a real thriller, Germantown topped host Friends' Central in double OT 77-71. The Tigers were led by Brandon Jones with 29 points. Three other Tigers hit double figures, led by Chris Hamilton with 18 (5-threes), Eric Abraham with 11 and Jason Tucker with 10. Michael Cook led the Phoenix with 25 points (4-threes) and Hakim Warrick added 14.

Only three games were played on Friday, January 21<sup>st</sup> because Moorestown had a snow day. Germantown played their second league thriller in a row, this time losing in double OT to Select, 59-58. Chris Arlene hit one of two free throws with under 7 seconds left to put the Falcons ahead for good. A final shot and two tips would not fall for the hosts. Select was paced by guards Walker (21 points, 13-18 from the line) and Schloss (17 points 9-10 from the line). Cliff Bell added 10 points and Arlene had 8. Select shot 2 free throws in the first half, 24 in the second half and 14 in the overtime periods on their way to a 29-40 team effort at the charity stripe. The Tigers were led by freshman Jason Tucker with 23 points. Jones added 11 and Hamilton had 9. Visiting Friends' Central overcame a 5-point halftime deficit with a 40-26 second half and topped George School 61-52. Cook led the winners with 20 points, while Ryan Tozer added 18. Mobley paced the Cougars with 14. Host Abington outscored Westtown in every quarter on the way to a 68-29 victory. The 'roos were led by Justin Luber with 24 and Slater with 16. Malcolm Davis paced Westtown with 13.

Friday's Moorestown-ANC game was made up on Monday, January 24<sup>th</sup>, with host Moorestown riding a 21-8 first quarter advantage to a 63-55 win. Wright led the winners with 25, while Washington added 19. Glunz had 22 and Junge 16 for the Lions. The Tuesday Select-Central game was postponed to Wednesday 2/9 due to the snow.

On Friday, January 28<sup>th</sup> host Westtown gained their first league win with a 55-48 decision over Moorestown. Wells led the winners with 18, while Whartnaby added 15

and Davis 10. Wright paced the Foxes with 23, while Briggs added 12. The Saturday George School – Germantown game was postponed to Tuesday, 2/15 because of Germantown's delayed exam schedule.

On Tuesday, February 1<sup>st</sup> host Abington used a 29 point second quarter to pull ahead of Friends' Central on the way to an 84-73 win in a rematch of last year's championship game. The 'roos had a balanced attack with Slater scoring 24, Luber 22, Taft 18 and Matt Stern 11 (3-threes). The Phoenix also had good balance with Cook tallying 22, Warrick 19, Tozer 12 and Willie Frank 11. Also on 2/1 ANC topped visiting Friends Select 73-64. The Lions forged a 9-point half-time lead, only to see the Falcons pull to within one after three periods, before they stretched the eventual margin back to 9. The Lions were 20-30 from the charity stripe. Junge and Glunz led the winners with 22 and 18 points. Herder and Drew Synnestvedt each added 10 to the cause. The Falcons were led by Cliff Bell with 18, while Schloss and Walker each added 14.

On Wednesday, 2/2 Germantown visited Moorestown and came home with a 45-31 victory, by outscoring the Foxes in each quarter. Jones and Hamilton each had 10 points for the Tigers, while Tucker added 9. Washington had 10 and Briggs 9 for the hosts who saw leading scorer Jackie Wright held scoreless for the first half and limited to 6 points overall.

## ABINGTON PLACES FIRST; GERMANTOWN SECOND

On Tuesday, February 1 visiting George School topped Westtown 55-43. Mario Anton led the Cougars with 18 points, while Malcolm Davis paced the hosts with 16.

On Friday, February 4 Abington visited Germantown and took home a 68-56 decision. The 'roos jumped out to an 8-point first quarter lead, only to see the Tigers claw back to a brief lead in the middle of the 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter before the visitors righted themselves and extended their lead to 12 by the final buzzer. Justin Luber paced a balanced Abington attack with 20. Seth Taft added 14, while Matt Stern and Ben Slater each chipped in 12. Jason Tucker led the Tigers with 19, while Brandon Jones had 15, and Eric Abraham and Chris Hamilton each had 10. Also on the 4<sup>th</sup> host Friends' Central beat ANC 70-53. Hakim Warrick led the Phoenix with 19 points, while Mike Cook added 17 and Ryan Tozer 13. Glen Herder paced the Lions with 15, while Derek Glunz added 13.

On Tuesday, February 8 Abington remained unbeaten in FSL play with an 85-66 home win over ANC. Slater led the 'roos with 16, while Erick Henighan added 15. Luber had 12 and Taft 11. Herder had 17, Glunz 16, Kevin Junge 14 and Drew Synnestvedt 10 for the Lions.

On Wednesday the 9<sup>th</sup> Central beat Select 73-58 in a game postponed from January 25<sup>th</sup>. Cook led the way with 22 (10 for 13 from the line), while Tozer added 19 and Warrick 12. Ryan Schloss led the Falcons with 19, while Khalief Walker had 13 and Chris Arlene 12.

## ABINGTON RETAINS TITLE 58-53 OVER FRIENDS' CENTRAL

Abington won its second consecutive title on Saturday, February 19<sup>th</sup> at Haverford College in a replay of last year's championship tilt. The game was very closely contested and well played throughout. The 'roos were paced by seniors Ben Slater with 19 points (and 19 rebounds), Justin Luber with 16 and Mike Ellis with 15. Slater ended his career with 1006 points. Luber (4) and Seth Taft (2) each hit crucial free throws in the final minute to maintain a slim lead and Ellis made a key steal and lay up to put the game out of reach. The Phoenix were led by Mike Cook with 23 points and Ryan Tozer with 14.

The Phoenix made it to the championship game with a thrilling hard-fought 49-46 win at Germantown Friends on Friday night. The visitors never trailed and never led by more than 7 points during the entire game, played before a very spirited overflow crowd of about 400. Tozer's free throw in the final 10 seconds put the Phoenix up by three and the Tigers' last second attempt to tie was off the mark. The winners were paced by Cook with 17 points and 13 rebounds. Hakim Warrick added 11 points, 11 rebounds and 6 blocks. Tozer contributed 12 points. Chris Hamilton led the Tiger attack with 18 points, including 4 threes (two from NBA range). Jason Tucker and Brandon Jones each added 11 points. Abington opened up a big lead in their semifinal game with Friends Select, before withstanding a 4<sup>th</sup> quarter comeback attempt by the Falcons to earn a 62-58 decision. The 'roos scored the first 12 points of the game, jumped out to a 26-10 first quarter advantage and led by 15 going into the final stanza. Select outscored the hosts 22-11 in the final period to make the final score a tight one. Slater had 22 points and 27 rebounds for the winners who also received double-digit scoring from Luber (15) and Taft (10). Benji Serinsky, recently elevated from the JV squad, led the Falcons with 16. Steve Cox netted 13 while Ryan Schloss added 12 points.

In a mirror image of the varsity championship, Abington won the JV tournament over Friends' Central 22-18 on Saturday, February 12<sup>th</sup> at Germantown. Abington needed to survive a mini playoff with Friends Select and George School to advance to the championship game from their bracket.
