## ANC REMAINS UNDEFEATED OVERALL; WESTTOWN AT 3-0 IN THE LEAGUE

In second round play on Friday, October 2<sup>nd</sup> marked by four shutouts, visiting ANC blanked Germantown 3-0 to extend their overall unbeaten streak to six games (2-0 in the league). Junior Anders Hyatt opened the scoring for the Lions with a 36<sup>th</sup> minute penalty kick. Sophomore Kian Holms added an insurance goal on a goalmouth scramble in the 70th minute and then Hyatt added icing to the win with an 80th minute goal with an assist from senior David Keith. Senior Jordan Walters was in goal for the shutout. Westtown pushed their FSL record to 3-0 with a 3-0 homefield win over Friends Select. Senior Paul Lehmann opened the scoring for the hosts with a 21st minute goal off an assist from classmate Steve Chidester. Sophomore Parker Theoni netted an unassisted goal in the 44th minute and classmate Tres Abbott finished the scoring in the 48th minute with an assist from senior Mike Lawson. Junior Vince Picciani made 5 saves en route to the shutout. George and Friends' Central were very evenly matched as the visiting Cougars took home a 1-0 win at the Phoenix' field. A ball nodded in by junior Andy Cino off a throw in by classmate Marc Parish in the 70th minute was the only tally. Sophomore Seth Shipon made five saves in goal for the shutout. Host Moorestown won their first game of the season with a 1-0 home-field blanking of Abington. Junior Brent Harrison tallied in the 30<sup>th</sup> minute with an assist from sophomore Jason Evans. Freshman Matt Stevens posted the shutout making eight saves.

In a very evenly matched JV tournament on Saturday the 3<sup>rd</sup>, ANC took home the plaque for the first time with 3 wins and tie in the 5-team round robin. The Lions were unscored upon. Germantown finished second, yielding only a single goal to ANC in their 2-1-1 finish. All but one of the ten 30-minute games ended either 1-0 or 0-0.

#### PLAYOFF TEAMS SET: POSITIONS STILL TO BE DETERMINED

Moorestown has made the playoffs for the first time since 1993 and only the fourth time overall. They are joined by Westtown, George School and ANC. Pairings for the semifinals and host teams will not be settled until the final round of regular season games is completed.

In third round play on Tuesday, October 6th Moorestown topped Select 3-2 in Fairmount Park. Junior Jackiem Wright tallied twice for the winners, while classmate Jerimiah Appleton converted a penalty kick as the visitors took a 3-0 lead and held off the Falcons who got goals from juniors Alloyius McIlwaine and Igancio Benedetti in the 29th and 55th minutes. Benedetti assisted on the first goal, while senior Alex Bianchi set up the second. At Abington, Germantown and Abington played to a 1-1 tie. Sophomore Elan Gepner scored for the Tigers in the 21st minute. Sophomore Colin Ellis evened the score in the 37th minute. Germantown had a significant shot advantage and Abington was kept in the game by junior keeper Mike Svitek who was credited with 16 saves, including several on breakaways. Friends' Central hosted Westtown and lost 2-1. The Phoenix opened the scoring in the 30<sup>th</sup> minute on a goal by senior Ted Vermeychuck assisted by classmate Jared Fertman. Senior Mike Lawson tallied on a header in the 47th minute and classmate Paul Lehman scored the game-winner on a 76th minute penalty kick after a hand ball call. At ANC, senior Carl Anderson tallied the only goal in the 54th minute of a 1-0 George School victory. Sophomore Seth Shipon made 9 saves for the Cougars and defender Dave Meshkov cleared a ball off the goal line after Shipon had been beaten in a first half play.

Fourth round play took place on Friday, October 9<sup>th</sup>. Host ANC lost to Westtown 2-1. All three goals were scored in the first quarter of the game. The visitors opened the scoring on a 3<sup>rd</sup> minute goal from sophomore Tres Abbot. ANC sophomore Joseph Herr evened matters with an 18-yard drive in the 9<sup>th</sup> minute. Junior Fiver Soraruf netted the game-winner on a corner kick which deflected off the keeper in the 18<sup>th</sup> minute. Friends Select ended a 21-game FSL losing streak dating back to October, 1995 with a 4-1 road win over Germantown. Benedetti had a hat-trick and McIlwaine netted the other goal with Benedetti's assist. Senior Kalen Pascal and freshman Michael Cohen also had assists. Tiger sophomore Rob Lane scored on a 73<sup>rd</sup> minute penalty kick to prevent a shutout. Host Friends' Central and Moorestown played to a 1-1 tie. Vermeychuck tallied in the 38<sup>th</sup> minute for the Phoenix, while Senior Ron Edwards knocked in a 74<sup>th</sup> minute goal to equalize for the Foxes. Host George School rode three first-half goals to a 4-1 win over Abington.

Senior Scott Klein opened the scoring in the 7<sup>th</sup> minute on a 30-yarder. Junior Marc Parish tallied on a deflected ball in the 21<sup>st</sup> minute and Anderson with an assist from freshman Josh Mandell closed out the first-half with a 38<sup>th</sup> minute goal. Abington got on the board in the 60<sup>th</sup> minute on a goal by junior Mike Ellis, assisted by Colin Ellis (no relation). Klein closed out the scoring in the 74<sup>th</sup> minute with an assist from senior Matt Lilienfeld.

Fifth round play was completed on Tuesday and Wednesday, October 13<sup>th</sup> and 14<sup>th</sup>. On Tuesday, visiting ANC topped Friends' Central 1-0 on a 30<sup>th</sup> minute goal by senior Scott Nash. Senior Jordan Walter was credited with one save in the goal for the Lions. On Wednesday Abington beat Friends Select also by 1-0. Mike Ellis scored off a scramble in the 52<sup>nd</sup> minute for the 'roos who got flawless keeping from Svitek. Also on the 14<sup>th</sup>, host Moorestown rode two early goals by junior Brent Harrison to a 4-1 win over Germantown. Harrison scored in the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> minutes. Germantown answered with a 47<sup>th</sup> minute goal from Gepner before sophomore Matt Cutler and Appleton closed out the scoring in the 57<sup>th</sup> and 78<sup>th</sup> minutes respectively.

Friday and Saturday, October 16th and 17th saw sixth round play. On Friday host Abington beat Friends' Central 2-0 behind two goals from Mike Ellis. The junior scored in the 20th and 70th minutes with an assist from senior Erick Becker on the second score. Svitek was again in goal for the shutout. In a real barn-burner, visiting ANC scored in the first half and then saw Friends Select tally three unanswered goals before the Lions responded with three of their own in the final 10 minutes of play to win 4-3. Nash opened the scoring in the 30th minute. Select's goals came between the 50th and 65th minutes, two by Cohen and one by Barston. ANC's comeback began in the 71st minute on a diving header by junior Anders Hyatt off a cross from senior David Keith. Nash scored again on a deflected cross in the 79th minute. Hyatt and Keith teamed up again for the game-winner in the final minute of play. In an upset, visiting Moorestown defeated George School 2-1. This was the first win for Moorestown over George since 1983. Sophomore Alexander Bernardi opened the scoring in the 14th minute for the Foxes, tallying after a corner kick. Appleton put the visitors up 2-0 in the 28th minute on a 25-yarder. Lilienfeld converted a penalty kick in the 73<sup>rd</sup> minute to put the Cougars on the board. On Saturday, Germantown put the first blemish on Westtown's league record and came within 3 minutes of defeating the front-runners. Sophomore Griffin Evans scored in the 20th minute for the Tigers with an assist from freshman Duncan Lloyd. The hosts held on until a 77th minute goal from Abbot with an assist from Lehman produced the final 1-1 result.

#### WESTTOWN AND GEORGE TIE; PLACE FIRST AND SECOND

Host Westtown and George played a very exciting 2-2 tie on Thursday, October 22<sup>nd</sup> which left Westtown in first place with 12 points and George in second place, one point behind. #### GEORGE WINS TITLE ON PENALTY KICKS AFTER 0-0 TIE

George School won their 9th FSL title by a 3-2 margin in penalty kicks after playing host Westtown to a scoreless tie through 110 minutes of regulation and overtime on Tuesday, November 3<sup>rd</sup>. Westtown suffered their second consecutive title game loss due to penalty kicks. There was not much to choose between the two boarding schools who also tied during the regular season. Both keepers, junior Vince Picciani for Westtown and sophomore Seth Shipon for George made some excellent saves during regulation and in overtime. Play was even through the first half but Westtown nearly scored just before the break. Sophomore Tres Abbott had a shot in the 39<sup>th</sup> minute cleared by Shipon and then Westtown had a direct from 20 yards which Shipon saved and senior Stephen Chidester headed off the crossbar just seconds before the whistle. Play continued even through the second half and into the overtime periods, with both teams having some chances and both keepers making some good saves. The sudden death overtimes were dominated by Westtown, but they were unable to capitalize on a rare keeper error and could not put the ball in the net. George School moved senior Carl Anderson into the goal for the penalty kick shoot out while Westtown stayed with Picciani. Both first kicks were saved and both second and third kicks were scored, although Anderson nearly saved the third from Westtown, parrying it just behind the post. Westtown's 4th shot was wide and their 5th one was high, while George's 4th shot was saved and the final shot taken by sophomore Curt Tanner was good into the right hand side netting. The win was George School's 100th overall in FSL play, easily the first team to reach that plateau.

The Cougars reached the championship game with an overtime win over ANC at home on Saturday, October 31st. Senior Scott Klein scored on a head ball off a corner kick from junior Mark Parrish in the 103rd minute. Shipon had 11 saves in goal for the winners, while senior Jordan Walter had five saves for the Lions. Westtown gained the championship round with a 3-0 home win over Moorestown, also on the 31st. Senior Paul Lehmann opened the scoring with a 27th minute penalty kick. Senior Adam Thertell headed in a Lehmann throw in the 42nd minute and Chidester closed out the scoring on a 25 yarder from Thertell in the 68th minute. Picciani had 8 saves while the Moorestown keeper had 12 saves.

#### RANKIN AND KEITH LEAD ALL-STARS

Senior sweeper Matt Rankin from Westtown was named to the all-state team by the Friends Schools League coaches and is joined by ANC senior midfielder David Keith on the all-Southeastern PA team. The two will play in the city vs. suburbs all-star game on Sunday, November 22<sup>nd</sup> at Holy Ghost Prep. The all-league team and honorable mention players will play as a team against a still-to-be-determined all star team from another league on Friday, November 27<sup>th</sup> at the UGH soccer complex.
