MOORESTOWN TOPS WESTTOWN

Moorestown beat Westtown for the first time in FSL play on Friday, September 20. The winners scored a 1-0 decision in the game played on the astroturf at Franklin Field as a preliminary to the Penn-Cornell contest. Senior stopper Rich Overholt scored the game's only goal about 12 minutes into the second half. He connected on a low hard shot from about 20 yards out after a counter-attack. Senior David Guthrie posted the shutout and garnered 14 saves for Moorestown which had the better of the play in the first half. After the goal Westtown began to come on, but could not net the equalizer. The game was played at a very fast pace due to the speed of the ball on the turf. Moorestown is 1-0-0 in league play and 2-0-0 overall. Westtown stands at 0-1-0 in the league and 1-4-0 overall.

SELECT SHUTS OUT ABINGTON

Host Friends Select notched a 1-0 victory over Abington in the league opener for both teams on Friday, September 20. Select scored late in the first half off a corner kick when an Abington defender headed the ball into his own goal. Although Select had a number of opportunities in the second half they could not increase their lead. Sophomore Step Nagy and Junior Gino Sparrow shared the shutout for the winners. The win was the first for Select in the league since the final game of 1982. Select is 1-0-0 in FSL play and 2-1-0 overall. Abington is 0-1-0 in the league and 0-5-1 overall.

FSL_COACHES_MEET

At a meeting on September 12th the FSL soccer coaches made the following decisions which were confirmed at the athletic directors' meeting on September 23rd:

- 1) Regular-season games will be two 40-minute halves, followed by two 10-minute overtime periods (not sudden death) if the game is tied. Ties at the end of overtime will stand.
- 2) Ties in the semifinal games will be broken by two 10-minute overtime periods (not sudden death) and then two 5-minute sudden death periods if needed. If the game is still tied, sets of penalty kicks will be taken as proscribed in the High School Federation rule book.
- 3) A tie in the final game will be broken in the same manner as in the semifinals, except that there will be no penalty kicks taken. If the game is still tied after the completion of the sudden death periods then co-champions will be declared.
- 4) Face guards and other non-cast protective gear must meet with the approval of both coaches and the referees before a player may wear such gear in a game. Casts, padded or otherwise, are strictly forbidden by High School Federation rules.

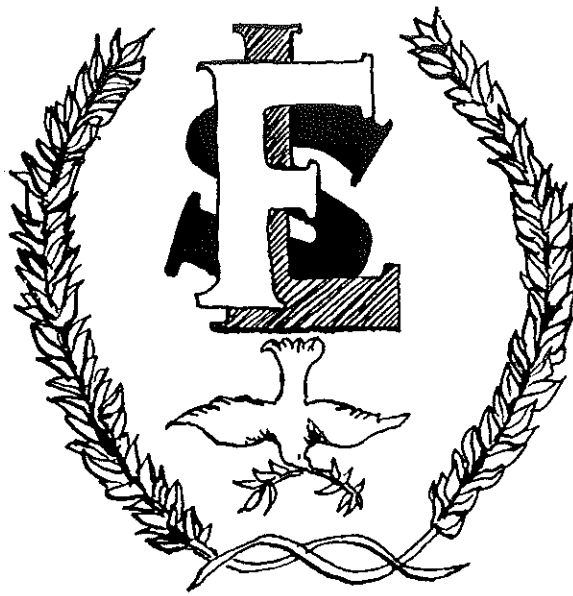

CENTRAL SHUTS OUT GEORGE

Visiting Friends' Central tallied a goal early in the second half and held on to defeat George School 1-0 on Tuesday, October 1. Junior Stephan Kay scored after a scramble in front of the George net about five minutes into the second half. Senior Fabrice Trombert contributed an assist. Both teams missed chances in the scoreless first half. The Phoenix had the better of the play early in the second half but George dominated for much of the middle of the period until the visitors resumed control near the end of the game. The shutout was shared by juniors Chris Dick and Andy Newcomb. Friends Central is now 1-0-0 in league play and 2-5-0 overall. George lost its third game of the season; its first in the league.

SELECT AND GEORGE PLAY SCORELESS TIE

On Friday, October 4 George School and Friends Select played a 0-0 tie at George. The score was indicative of the evenness of the play. George, however, missed a golden opportunity when a penalty kick went wide with about two minutes left in regulation time. Senior Neal Cordova was responsible for the George half of the shutout while Sophomore Step Nagy and Junior Eugene Sparrow shared the netminding for Select. Select is now 1-0-1 in FSL play and 2-2-1 overall. George is 0-1-1 in the league and 0-3-1 overall.

ABINGTON BLANKS MOORESTOWN

Senior stopper Matt Sherman banged in a goal about 10 minutes into the first half and the Kangaroos of Abington held on to defeat visiting Moorestown 1-0 on Friday, October 4. Abington, which won for the first time this year, had the better of the play through the first half but Moorestown came on during the second stanza. Surprisingly, both teams played better while travelling uphill. Senior goaltender Jeff Hoffman posted the shutout for the hosts. Abington evened its league mark at 1-1-0 while raising its overall record to 1-6-1. Moorestown dropped to 1-1-0 in the league and 2-2-1 overall.

WESTTOWN TOPS GERMANTOWN

Host Westtown tallied three goals in the final fifteen minutes of play to complete a 4-0 shutout of Germantown on Friday, October 4. Senior midfielder Burch Wilkes scored late in the first half to put the hosts up 1-0 at intermission. Junior Tom Kuchel assisted. Wilkes scored again from about 25 yards with an assist from Senior Mac Bonner late in the second half and then the flood gates opened. Junior Rick O'Gorman and Kuchel quickly added to the Westtown total. Senior Eric Felix posted the shutout. The win evened Westtown's league mark at 1-1-0 and upped their overall record to 2-4-2. Germantown is 0-1-0 in the FSL and 0-5-2 overall.

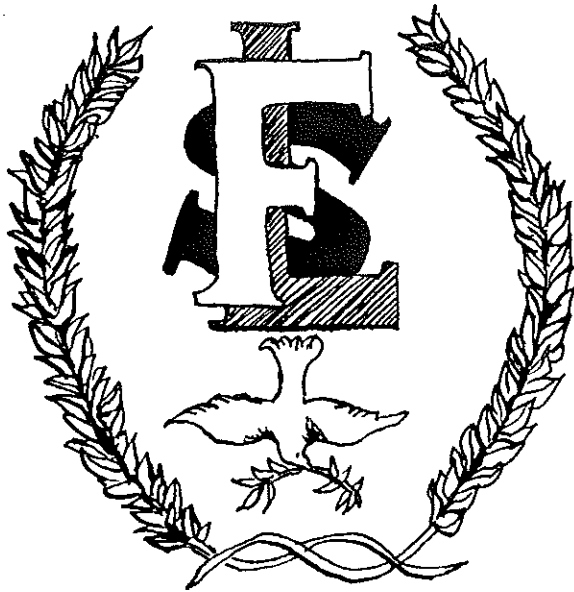

WESTTOWN SHUTS OUT SELECT

Junior Tom Kuchel's goal with about five minutes remaining in the game propelled visiting Westtown to a 1-0 victory over Friends Select on Tuesday, October 8. In an evenly played game, Westtown had the better chances in the first half while Select had its good chances in the second half. However, Senior Eric Felix was equal to the Falcons and posted the shutout for Westtown. The win raised Westtown's FSL mark to 2-1-0 and their overall record to 3-4-2. Select fell to 1-1-1 in the league and 2-3-1 overall.

CENTRAL THUMPS MOORESTOWN

Visiting Friends' Central scored early and often in a 5-0 win over Moorestown on Tuesday, October 8. Junior Dan Klein opened the scoring only 25 seconds into the game. Senior Fabrice Trombert assisted by senior Ben Kell scored at the 3:05 mark. Junior Steve Kay closed out the first half scoring with an assist by senior Rob Lager at 16:30. Silverstein's game-winner was taken from about 25 yards. Senior Andrew Erickson closed out the scoring with a penalty kick about 3 minutes from the final whistle. 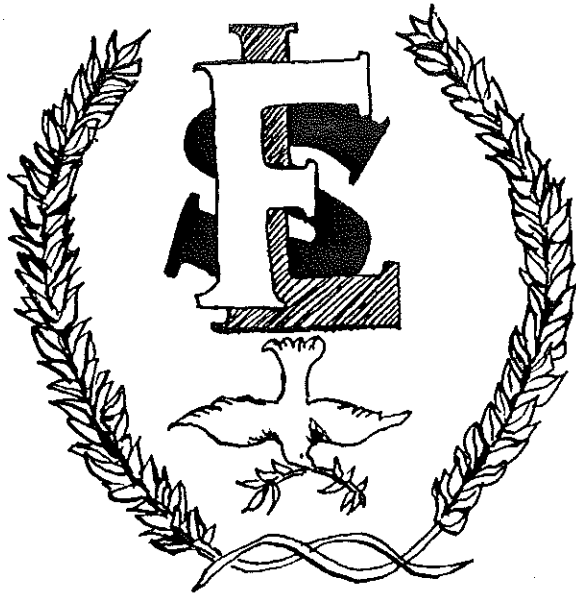

FRIENDS' CENTRAL WINS CHAMPIONSHIP

Host Friends' Central used two second half goals to beat George School 2-0 on Tuesday, November 5th and win the Friends Schools League championship. In a scoreless first half Friends' Central had somewhat the better of the play although George unloaded some dangerous shots. Central threatened twice off corner kicks late in the half. A fine save by George keeper Neal Cordova at the eight minute mark of the second half yielded a Phoenix corner kick. Senior Ben Kell lofted his kick to the far 18 corner. Senior Rob Lager headed the ball back towards the goal where senior Fabrice Trombert nodded it into the net. The 1-0 score held up until 31 minutes into the half when Trombert broke down the right wing and hit a long cross which the diving Cordova could not hold onto and junior Peter Klein came in from the left wing to put the ball in the goal. Junior goalie Andy Newcomb made the shutout hold up for the final nine minutes. Friends' Central is the first team in the five years of FSL play to repeat as champion, having won their initial title in 1982. They finished their season 7-1-0 in the league and 9-6-0 overall. George ended their league play at 4-2-2 and was 5-4-3 going into their final non-league game against Penn-Jersey Conference champion Girard College on Friday, November 8.

GEORGE AND FRIENDS' CENTRAL WIN CLOSE SEMIFINALS

Both semifinal games played on Saturday, November 2 were close contests won by the home teams by the narrowest of margins. In a rematch of the previous Saturday's regular season contest, George School hosted Westtown. The first meeting ended 0-0 and it looked as if this would be the playoff outcome

as well until a Westtown hand ball in the penalty area resulted in a George School penalty kick with about five minutes remaining in regulation time. Junior Ted Weigl netted the kick and senior goalie Neal Cordova maintained the shutout. George stretched its league unbeaten string to six games (4-1-2) and its overall unbeaten streak to eight games (5-3-3). Westtown, which failed to score in its final six games, ended up 2-3-2 in FSL play and 3-8-4 overall.

Friends' Central and Friends Select also met in a rematch of their previous Friday's contest. This time Select and Central traded goals, with each team scoring once in each half. Senior Willy Braveman opened the scoring for Select assisted by senior Tony Silverstein. Junior Dan Klein answered for Central with an assist by Rich Grossman. Junior Dave Criden regained the lead for the Falcons with an assist by senior Peter Schall only to see the Phoenix retie the game with about ten minutes left in regulation time on a goal by senior Fabrice Trombert assisted by senior Jamie Freundlich. With no goals in two full and two sudden-death overtimes, the game had to be decided on penalty kicks which the hosts won 4-3. Central moved into the championship game with a 6-1-0 FSL record and an 8-6-0 overall mark. Select ended their season at 2-3-2 in the league and 4-5-3 overall.

POAGE AND LAGER LEAD ALL-LEAGUE SELECTIONS

Senior midfielders Michael Poage from George School and Rob Lager from Friends' Central were named the outstanding players in the Friends Schools League by the league coaches. They will be named to the Eastern Pennsylvania Soccer Coaches All-Star team and will play in the Super Soccer Classic at Villanova on December 7. They are joined by thirteen other players on the Friends Schools League all-league team.
