WESTTOWN OPENS LEAGUE PLAY WITH TWO WINS.

Westtown beat new league member Academy of the New Church 8-1 on Friday, September 16, and Germantown 4-0 a week later, to go along with a non-league win over Sanford School in the opening two weeks of play. Westtown spread out the scoring in their win over ANC. Bryan Allen scored twice and six other players each tallied once. ANC's goal came from Jesse King on a penalty kick. Against Germantown the visitors scored on four breakaways, three in the first half, while goalie Brandon James chalked up the shutout. Goals came from Brooke Eaton, John Cookson, Adam Dewan and Tony Gendre.

Friends' Central shut out ANC 7-0 to open the league season on Tuesday, September 13, while Moorestown topped the newcomers 8-1 on Thursday, September 22. In the first game the Phoenix were paced by Mark Fifer with three goals and Jesse Porter and Shegei Gamada with two each. Chris Platt and Dan Goldstein each had two assists and Dan Colon assisted once. Jason Johns notched the shutout. In the Moorestown game the winners had four goals by Jim Bonder, three by Dave Baiada and one from Jamie McCracken who also contributed 4 assists. Bonder, Durrel Bouchard and David Pettigrew also had assists. ANC's goal was scored by Lowen Lermite.

CLOSE PLAY, LAST-SECOND SCORES, IN 2ND LEAGUE WEEK.

All three league games during the past week were decided by one goal, with one of them going into overtime, and also featuring goals just before the final whistle of each half. On Tuesday, September 27, George School traveled to Friends' Central and controlled play for much of the first half, scoring in the 40th minute, just before the end of the half. Bill Thompson headed in a Krispin Leydon corner kick. The hosts had the better of the play in the second half, but couldn't score until seconds before the final whistle when defender Dan Goldstein knocked in a loose ball, unassisted. The Cougars netted the decisive goal in the 7th minute of the second overtime when junior Sebastian Funke scored with the assist going to senior Justin Louchheim.

Friday, September 30 saw two visiting teams eke out 1-0 wins. Friends' Central scored in the 8th minute of the game at Germantown, as Mark Fifer netted a 20-yarder, unassisted, after the defense failed to clear. The hosts came on strong in the final 20 minutes of the first half and for much of the second half, but the Phoenix held on, with the shutout going to Jason Johns. Although Moorestown outshot Abington, the visiting Kangaroos had the only shot to cross the goal line. Todd Berger converted a bouncing ball in the box in the 62nd minute, with the assist going to Joe Arnold. The 'roos' goalie, Mike Haberman, notched the shutout and kept them in the contest with numerous outstanding saves.

WESTTOWN, GEORGE STAY ON TOP

On Tuesday, October 4 host George School bunched 5 goals in two groups to top Germantown 5-1. The Cougars scored twice just before the half and once immediately after and then waited until the last minute of play to tally twice more. Chinezi Chijioke scored the first two goals, assisted on the first by Matt Skilton. Christian Donovan tallied two minutes into the second half. The Tigers got on the board with a 71st minute goal by David Ross, assisted by Jamie Stevens, before the hosts closed out the day with two goals in the final minute. Bill Thompson, unassisted and Justin Louchheim from Quinn Kerrigan were the scorers.

On Thursday, October 6 host Moorestown scored first, but Westtown then took over and finished victorious at 4-1. Daniel Sanchez opened the scoring for the hosts in the 6th minute with the assist going to Jim Bonder. Westtown scored in the 23rd minute as Derek Smith tallied unassisted after a restart came off the defense. Seven minutes later Scott Montgomery scored with the assist to Smith. Montgomery netted his second goal in the 48th minute on an unassisted effort. Smith then closed out the scoring in the 70th minute with the assist coming from Bryan Allen.

On Friday, October 7 visiting Germantown waited until the 94th minute of play to score, and then tallied again just two minutes later to beat Abington 2-0 in double overtime. Abington had the better of the play in the first half with several good scoring opportunities. The Tigers came on in the second half and slowly began to turn the tide. There were a number of good scoring chances, including what seemed like a certain goal just in the final seconds of regulation. The overtime periods proved to be all in the favor of the visitors, who had four excellent scoring chances in the first OT, to no avail. Finally, four minutes into the second OT, Alex Frenkel netted a 25 yarder with the assist coming from Gabe Tames. Two minutes later Peter Shrier secured the win with an assist from David Ross. Ben Schindler notched the shutout for GFS, the first in his varsity career.

WESTTOWN, GEORGE STILL UNDEFEATED

On Tuesday, October 11, Friends' Central visited Abington and took home a 3-0 win. Mark Fifer scored in the fifth minute with the assist coming from Jesse Porter, and the 1-0 score held through halftime. Shigei Yamada scored twice in the first 10 minutes of the second half to clinch the win for the Phoenix. Porter assisted on one of the goals. Jason Johns tended for the shutout.

A 16th minute goal by Sebastian Funke, assisted by Bill Thompson, led George School to a 1-0 win at Select on Wednesday, October 12. Funke connected from 20 yards out to give the Cougars the only score they needed as Paul Greenblatt turned aside 11 shots to register the shutout.

On Friday, October 14 Greenblatt and Mike Kreisberg shared the goaltending duties in a 2-0 win over visiting Abington. After a scoreless first half, Chinezi Chijioke tallied on a diving header in the 51st minute, with the cross coming from Brandon Rock. In the 72nd minute, Thompson iced the win with a penalty kick goal. 'Roo keeper Mike Haberman was credited with 27 saves.

In a game with a very similar pattern, visiting Moorestown beat Select 2-0 also on October 14. After a scoreless first half, Dave Baiada scored about 15 minutes into the second half off a throw from Jim Bonder. Some 10 minutes later, Bonder iced the win with a penalty kick. Moorestown keeper David Gougelet was credited with 12 saves and his defense played very well in front of him to maintain the shutout.

On Saturday, October 15 the league's string of close games continued as Westtown topped host Friends' Central 2-1 at the loser's homecoming. Westtown took a 1-0 lead into the half with an unassisted goal from Scott Montgomery about 30 minutes in. The Phoenix evened the score about 15 minutes into the second half on an unassisted tally from Porter. The visitors took home the win with a last-minute goal from Adam DeWan off a Ken Jacobsen throw in. Friends' Central had a goal called back on an offsides call.

THREE PLAYOFF TEAMS SET; ANC WINS FIRST

On Tuesday, October 18 George School beat host ANC 5-0. Sebastian Funke opened the scoring in the 3rd minute with an assist from Brandon Rock. Chinezi Chijioke scored the next two goals in the 14th and 39th minutes with assists from Funke and Masa Ishiguro. Ishiguro scored in the 49th minute assisted by Quinn Kerrigan, who then scored in the 51st minute with the assist to Bill Thompson. Paul Greenblatt had 13 saves in the shutout.

On Wednesday, October 19 Germantown Friends resumed league play after a 12-day hiatus, and beat visiting Friends Select 1-0. Brendan Jones scored on a head ball over onrushing Falcon keeper Paul Norris in the 14th minute. Jonah Peterson got the assist on a through ball. Norris kept the Falcons close with 15 saves, at least three of them on breakaways. Tiger keeper Ben Schindler notched his second straight shutout, tallying 8 saves. Tiger striker Alex Frenkel was particularly effective.

On Friday, October 21 visiting Moorestown gave up two penalty kicks to George School in the first 10 minutes before battling back in a very competitive game. The PKs, one on a hand ball at 5:40 and the other on a trip at 9:30 were both converted by Chinezi Chijioke in nearly identical fashion. Three and a half minutes later the visitors were awarded a direct from about 25 yards out and Dave Baiada found Jim Bonder on a pass around the wall. Bonder's hard shot deflected past Greenblatt. For the rest of the half there were good scoring chances for both teams, and one particularly acrobatic save by Greenblatt. In the second half George had more chances and controlled play more of the time, but Moorestown keeper Dave Gougelet kept the Cougars off the board and his teammates within striking distance.

Also on Friday, October 21 a much improved ANC squad brought home its first FSL win with a 3-1 victory at Abington. The Lions tallied first in the 9th minute on an unassisted goal by Francis Darkwah. The 'roos evened it up with a Ben Martin goal in the 18th minute. The 1-1 tie remained through the half and until Jesse King scored in the 47th minute with an assist from Daryl Baker. King iced the win in the 73rd minute on a direct kick. ANC keeper Reuben Grubb had 19 saves and was on the sidelines being treated for an injury when Abington scored.

On Saturday, October 22 ANC came right back into action, facing Germantown at the Tiger's homecoming. King scored in the 3rd minute and Baker in the 39th minute (after a GFS missed PK) to put the visitors up 2-0 at the half. Germantown turned things around with three goals in a 10 minute stretch, midway through the second half. Peter Shrier opened the scoring for GFS with an assist from Mark Goodheart in the 58th minute.

David Ross netted the tying goal in the 65th minute and Seth Laver knocked in a loose ball in the 67th minute for the gamewinner. The final assist in the 3-2 win went to Alex Frenkel.

Also on Saturday, October 22 host Friends' Central blanked Friends Select 3-0. The Phoenix tallied on two Mark Fifer penalty kicks sandwiching a rebound goal by Andrew Finger. Fifer's goals came in the 34th and 50th minutes and Finger made the halftime score 2-0 with a 38th minute score. Jason Johns tended for the shutout with 5 saves.

GEORGE WINS FIFTH IN A ROW IN OT

A goal by substitute forward Brad Loberg in the 6th minute of the second overtime proved to be the winner for visiting George School, 2-1 over Westtown on Tuesday, November 8. Loberg converted on a ball from David Peasley after a scramble in front of the net soon after he had entered the game. The game, played before a crowd of about 300 people, was a very exciting and entertaining one which saw Westtown with many more dangerous chances and more control of the play throughout both halves and both overtime periods. In the first half Cougar keeper Paul Greenblatt was forced to make three big saves in the 6th, 8th and 27th minutes and a Westtown header went just over the bar in the 35th minute. Westtown keeper Brandon James made one big save in the 22nd minute. After the hosts started the second half with similar control of the play, George captain Krispin Leydon made a 30 yard run with the ball and shot to the far post from 12 yards for an unassisted goal in the 51st minute. Westtown stormed right back with two headers which just missed in the 53rd minute. George controlled matters for about 10 minutes and then the hosts took over again. Greenblatt made a fine save on a high cross from Brook Eaton in the 68th minute and then Leydon headed away a potential goal two minutes later. In the 71st minute Eaton launched a blast which hit the bottom of the crossbar before ricocheting across the goal. Finally in the 75th minute Adam Dewan scored from 5 yards out on a ball from Ian Henderson. Two minutes later Eaton smacked another ball off the crossbar and in the 78th minute Dewan had two good chances to no avail. In the first OT, Westtown swarmed in front of the goal for the first two minutes before things settled for a while, but between the 7th and 9th minutes they had four corner kicks, the last one needing a good punch save in the sun to turn it away. In the second OT James stopped a Leydon breakaway in the 4th minute while Greenblatt made the game winning save in the 5th minute, a diving effort on a direct kick from 25 yards. Loberg's goal was opportunistic and snuffed out Westtown's title hopes.

In semifinal action on Friday, November 4 both host teams won by shutouts, but there the similarities ended. Westtown had all they could handle with a fired up Germantown squad. The Tigers controlled play during the first half and outshot the hosts 6-2, but could not score, despite some good chances. In the second half Westtown turned the tables and controlled much of the play. The game remained

scoreless into the 58th minute when Derek Smith crossed the ball to a momentarily open John Cookson who knocked the ball home. Westtown had a few more good opportunities and Germantown also had a chance or two, but no one else scored in a very thrilling contest. James had 6 saves for the shutout. Ben Schindler had 15 saves for the losers, some of them spectacular. In the other semifinal game the 5-0 score was not indicative of the closeness of the contest, but it was certainly decisive. George School shot well and made the most of their opportunities. Chinezi Chijioke scored first in the 19th minute with the assist coming from Sebastian Funke. These two switched roles on a 37th minute score. Justin Louchheim started both of the goal-scoring plays. In the 43rd minute Bill Thompson scored off a Leydon corner kick. Thompson scored again 4 minutes later on a breakaway from a Louchheim through ball. Freshman Peasley finished the scoring in the 78th minute with the assist from Matt Skilton.

REGULAR SEASON WRAP-UP
