ANC WINS TWICE, GERMANTOWN ONCE IN LEAGUE OPENERS

In the League's season-opener on Friday, September 13, host ANC topped Westtown 3-1. Senior Will Cowley opened the scoring for the Lions with a 30-yarder in the 18th minute. In the 39th minute Charlie Carter knotted the score for the visitors as he finished a loose ball after a corner kick. Senior Isaac Smith netted the game-winner in the 60th minute on a header off a cross from Cowley. Junior Sean King added insurance for the hosts on a shot from deep right outside the penalty box in the 70th minute. Collin Cooper had 11 saves for ANC.

On Friday, September 20 ANC notched their second win with a 4-0 decision over visiting Moorestown. Smith opened the scoring with an unassisted left-side 30-yarder in the 7th minute. In the 20th minute King scored from the left side of the penalty box with an assist from junior Scott Simmons. Cowley closed out the first half scoring in the 32nd minute on a direct kick which eluded both the keeper and Lowen Lermite's attempted header. Cowley closed out the scoring in the 67th minute on a shot from the 18 which deflected off a Moorestown defender. Cooper had 12 saves to preserve the shutout.

Also on September 20 host Germantown rode two goals by senior captain Pete Shrier to a 2-1 win over Westtown. The Tigers had a goal called back for offside in the 6th minute, before Shrier tallied his first in the 14th minute. Tiger keeper Ben Schindler started the play with a big punt to junior Andy Vick who headed the ball on to Shrier. Shrier's second tally came in the 37th minute on a shot from inside the penalty box on the right side after a solo run. The score held at 2-0 into the 75th minute when Brendan Mahon hit a 30-yarder from the left into the upper-right side netting. Schindler recorded 9 saves in the win.

GEORGE SCHOOL, GERMANTOWN AND ABINGTON VICTORIOUS IN WEEK II

George School opened defense of its FSL title with a 4-1 road win against Friends' Central on Wednesday, September 25. The host Phoenix opened the scoring in the 12th minute on a goal by Chip Schofield. The lead was short-lived, however, as the Cougars responded within a minute on a goal by junior Carlos Smith after a melee in front of the goal mouth. Senior John Schorr got the assist. George forged ahead in the 29th minute on an 18-yarder from the left by senior Masa Ishiguro assisted by Smith. Smith tallied again in the 40th minute from about 15 yards out on the left with an assist from junior Adam Decker. The score remained 3-1 for almost the entire second half until Decker had a tuck away goal in the 79th minute assisted by Schorr. Senior keeper Paul Greenblatt for George made 7 saves in the first half, including three very strong efforts. Junior Adam Wadin took over in the second half and also recorded 7 saves. Shots for the game were even at 17 apiece.

On Friday, September 27 Abington visited Moorestown and came home with a 2-1 win, breathing a collective sigh of relief at the end as the hosts missed a penalty kick with less than two minutes left in regulation. Seniors Mike Plotkin and Gerry Hoffner scored for the 'roos in the 18th and 20th minutes. The 2-0 score held up until the 58th minute when senior Christian Abrahamson tallied for the hosts with an assist from sophomore Ron Edwards. Moorestown's penalty kick was hit directly to the Abington keeper to hold the final score at 2-1.

On Saturday, September 28 host Germantown topped Friends Select 2-1, despite spectacular goal keeping by the Falcons' Matt Maiello. The game was a thriller with all three goals scored in the last eight minutes of play. In a scoreless first half, Maiello made several saves of sure goals to keep the visitors in the game. The Tigers had the play in the Falcons' half for almost 35 minutes, but could not score. In the second half the visitors pressed forward a bit more, but it was still Maiello who kept them in the game with several outstanding saves. It was not until the 72nd minute that he was beaten on a perfectly placed 35-yarder by sophomore Will Sicks over Maiello's head into the far side netting. The Falcons did not give up, though, and tied the score three minutes later on a well-bent direct kick by Mutlu Onaral from about 20 yards out on the right. Junior Drew Magaziner scored the game winner for the hosts on a breakaway in the 79th minute after a through ball from freshman Mark Dilks. Maiello had 15 saves, while Tiger keeper Ben Schindler notched only one.

GEORGE SCHOOL, ANC REMAIN UNDEFEATED

Although both schools have been tied, neither George nor ANC has been defeated in FSL play with only two weeks remaining in regular season play. Germantown, with only one league loss, is still in the hunt for second place. Here are summaries of the recent league games.

On Tuesday, October 1 Moorestown traveled to Select and won 2-0 breaking a 12-game FSL losing streak. The visitors opened the scoring in the 39th minute on a goal by freshman Jackim Wright assisted by senior Jon-Mark Carter. Senior Christian Abrahamson provided some breathing room with a goal in the 60th minute, assisted by senior David Pettigrew. Junior Jeff Croshaw made 8 saves in the shutout.

On October 2nd George School beat visiting Germantown 4-0. The Cougars scored twice in each half with goals scored by Adam Decker, Carlos Smith, Masa Ishiguro and Dan Biros. Biros and Matt Lilienfeld contributed assists while Adam Wadin tended goal for the shutout.

On October 4th the first of 6 overtime games in the past two weeks took place at Abington. Visiting ANC won 2-1 on a breakaway goal by senior Will Cowley with 2 minutes left in the second overtime. The 'roos had taken the lead on an 11th minute goal by Jon Lavinier. The Lions came right back with a 13th minute goal by Isaac Smith with an assist from Lowen Lermite.

Also on the 4th Westtown traveled to Moorestown and came home with the most one-sided result of the season so far. The visitors scored four times in the first half and added two more in the second stanza to beat the hosts 6-1. Westtown had three goals from Tomas Gal, two from Adam Dewan and one from Charlie Carter. Dewan and Paul Heller contributed assists. Moorestown's lone score came on a first-half penalty kick by freshman Jerry Appleton.

On October 5th and again on the 9th Germantown hosted games which ended in 1-1 ties after OT. On the 5th, Friends' Central provided the opposition for the Tigers who opened the scoring in the 12th minute of the game on a goal by Drew Magaziner with an assist from Sean Weinstein. Dan Silver knotted the score for the Phoenix in the 37th minute, assisted by Mike Martino. Both teams had some good scoring chances but no one could capitalize in the final 60 minutes of play. In a remarkably similar game on the 9th, Academy of the New Church visited the Tigers. Magaziner again opened the scoring, this time on a direct kick from about 25 yards out in the 17th minute. The Lions goal came just 30 seconds before half-time on a direct kick by Lermite. Magaziner's 30 yard turn-around shot hit the inside of the right post and caromed across the goal mouth untouched with just 30 seconds left in the second overtime period.

Also on the 9th, George School took home a 4-0 road win at Friends Select. Junior David Peasley opened the scoring in the second minute with an assist from Decker. Ishiguro then scored off a Peasley throw-in in the 14th minute. Decker headed in a ball from Smith in the 58th minute and Ishiguro tallied again four minutes later with an assist from Ahren Warf. Wadin and John Schorr shared the shutout.

On October 11th George hosted Abington in game which was very even, but finished 2-0 to the hosts. Schorr opened the scoring in the 16th minute with an assist from Smith and then Smith tallied seconds before the half-time whistle with an assist from Peasley. George missed a second-half indirect kick from inside the 6 and Abington had some good chances to score, but Cougar keeper Paul Greenblatt turned everything aside, including one particularly fine save.

On Saturday, October 12 Friends' Central hosted Westtown and notched a 3-1 overtime win. Although the Phoenix had somewhat the better of the play in the first half, Gal tallied first for the visitors in the 20th minute off a rebound. In the second half Westtown had the better of the play but was stuffed on a breakaway attempt and could not convert any other opportunities. The hosts knotted the score in the 50th minute when Matt Murphy scored after a keeper error. Martino scored the game-winner 8 minutes into the first OT with an assist from Jared Fertman. Silver put the game on ice 6 minutes into the second OT with an assist from Walter Richards.

Three days later, ANC visited Friends' Central and took home a 1-1 tie. The visitors opened the scoring on Cowley's 5th league goal of the season, a 38th minute breakaway with an assist from Ron Schnarr. The Phoenix evened the score in the 55th minute on an Andy Kim goal after a pile up from about 5 yards out. Both teams had chances in the overtime periods, but neither could convert.

On October 16th Abington hosted Friends' Central in a game originally rained out on 10/8. The 'roos won 2-0 on second-half goals by Lavinier and Gerry Hoffner in the 62nd and 76th minutes. Mike Plotkin assisted on both goals. The first came after an indirect kick and the second was a breakaway after a through ball. The hosts had a first-half goal called back. Mike Haberman recorded the shutout with 8 saves.

October 18th saw George host Moorestown with the result being a scoreless tie. This was the first 0-0 tie in league play since 1988. Most of the game was played in the midfield area with not too many scoring chances by either side.

GERMANTOWN TAKES TITLE FOR FIRST TIME SINCE 1983

Germantown Friends won the FSL soccer championship for only the second time with a 3-0 home-field win over Abington Friends on Tuesday, November 5. The Tigers tallied once in the first half and added two more early in the second half to capture the win. The first goal came in the 15th minute when junior Sean Weinstein sent a through ball to junior Drew Magaziner on the right wing. Magaziner took the ball deep and sent it back across the middle where Weinstein slammed it home. This came about 5 minutes after a 'roo defender had cleared a ball off the goal line. The hosts got some significant breathing room with a solo goal by senior captain Peter Shrier in the first minute of the second half. In the 54th minute junior Andy Vick headed a ball beyond the reach of keeper Mike Haberman and Shrier knocked it into the goal. Senior Ben Schindler made 7 saves for the shutout. Both sweepers, junior Ramsey Haig from Abington and junior Jake Schulz from Germantown played strong games.

The Tigers, who won their previous title over Abington in 1983, had only been to two championship games since then, losing to George School in 1987 and 1991. They had also lost to Friends' Central in 1982. The 'roos had not been in a championship game since 1984 when they won their only title over Westtown. The game was the first championship ever matching the regular-season third and fourth place teams. Westtown missed the playoffs for the first time since 1986 and George School was not in the championship game for the first time since 1984.

Germantown got to the finals with a 2-0 road win over George School in a semifinal game on Friday, November 1. After a scoreless first half which saw both teams have some good chances, Shrier knocked in a rebound of his own shot past the prone keeper who was then red-carded on the play in the 51st minute. The Cougars then played about 12 minutes of their best soccer, down a man. They repeatedly threatened and hit a post and a very solid crossbar shot. In the 67th minute as the Tigers moved play out of their defensive zone, Vick fed the ball down the right wing and Magaziner took it past the defense and nailed a shot past the keeper from about 25 yards on the far right which was lucky enough to kiss the far post and carom in. Schindler notched 12 saves for the shutout. Schulz, again, was a life-saver on defense. The win, which halted George's remarkable streak of 11 straight championship game appearances, was the first for GFS over the Cougars since 1987.

Abington also won on the road on Friday, topping regular-season first place finisher Academy of the New Church, 3-0. After a scoreless first half which saw the 'roos have the better of the play, junior John Lavinier headed in

a cross from sophomore Gerry Hoffner in the 55th minute. Following this goal, ANC dominated for the next 7 minutes or so, but the Abington defense did not yield. Play evened out again, before the Lions, needing to press forward in an attempt to score, gave up two late goals on counter-attacks. Senior Mike Plotkin scored in the 73rd minute on an assist from Lavinier and two minutes later Hoffner scored from Lavinier. Haberman had 6 saves in the shutout performance. Abington reversed their fate of last year, when they came in first in the regular season, only to fall to fourth place Westtown in a semifinal.

Ten league games were played during the final two weeks of the regular season. During this period final placings were determined and half of these games were decided by one-goal margins. ANC shut out Select and George to claim first place, while Germantown topped Moorestown and Abington, both on the road, to notch the third spot. Abington edged the fast-finishing Phoenix from Friends' Central for the final spot in the playoffs. A summary of these games follows:

On Tuesday, October 22 ANC traveled to Select and came home a 1-0 winner on a 50th minute head ball goal from Lowen Lermite with an assist from Will Cowley. Collin Cooper had 3 saves for the visitors. Falcon keeper Matt Maiello had a tremendous game to keep the hosts close.

Also on the 22nd Abington visited Westtown and took home a 1-0 win. Westtown had some very good chances, particularly by Adam Dewan, but a 68th minute goal by Kenny Weiner with an assist from Hoffner was all the 'roos needed as Haberman notched 12 saves.

Germantown took the third road win on the 22nd with a 2-1 victory at Moorestown. The Tigers opened the scoring in the 34th minute on a Shrier goal off a through ball from Vick. The hosts knotted the score shortly after the second-half tap on a chip ball goal from Christian Abrahamson with an assist from John-Mark Carter. Vick netted the game-winner on a solo effort in the 59th minute.

On Friday, the 25th Friends' Central topped Moorestown 2-0. Andy Kim scored in the 20th minute with an assist from Geoff Sheau. Kim then iced the win in the 45th minute with an assist from Mike Martino. Ryan Hardin was in goal for the shutout.

Also on the 25th host Abington thrashed Select 6-0. Hoffner scored twice, while Lavinier, Weiner, Brian Shaper, Chris D'Angelo and Matt McClosky each tallied once. McClosky added three assists, while Weiner and Shaper each had one.

In a typical George-Westtown game on the 25th, the visiting Cougars held off the hard-charging hosts and won 1-0 on a 75th minute goal by Masa Ishiguro after a goal-mouth scramble. The win came despite a 25-14 shot advantage for Westtown and required 15 saves by keeper Paul Greenblatt.

On Monday, October 28th Friends' Central beat host Select 4-0 in a game rained out on October 19th. Kim, Sheau, Martino and Walter Richards scored

for the Phoenix, who led 3-0 at the half. Sheau had an assist and Matt Murphy added two.

On October 29th, the final three games of the regular season saw Westtown blank visiting Select 8-0, ANC take first place with a 2-0 home win over George, and Germantown secure third place with a 2-1 road win over Abington. Westtown had 2 goals each from Dewan, Qais Biltaji and Tamas Gal and single goals from Charlie Carter and Jason Robinson. Paul Heller had two assists, while Gal, Biltaji, Nelson Ramos and Adam Gibboney each had one. ANC clinched first place behind two unassisted goals from Will Cowley in the 27th and 53rd minutes.
