WESTTOWN 2-0, ANC 2-1 IN SEASON OPENERS

Westtown and Acadamy of the New Church opened the seventeenth season of FSL boys' soccer on Friday, September 12. The host Quakers scored in the 9th minute on a goal by sophomore Fiver Soruruf off an assist from senior Adam Dewan and held on for a 1-0 win. Junior keeper Nelson Ramos made 7 saves to maintain the shutout. The Lions returned to their home pitch on Tuesday, September 16 and topped Abington Friends 4-1. ANC opened the scoring in the 6th minute on a goal by Robin Cooper off a cross from the right side by David Keith. The 1-0 score held through the middle of the second half when the hosts bunched three goals in a 15 minute span. Sean King scored in the 59th and 75th minutes on assists from Keith and Hunter Lermitte. In between Jordan Walter scored with an assist from Mike Thomas. The 'roos got on the board in the 76th minute on a goal by junior Andy Heinrich with an assist from sophomore Dan Dratch. Then on Thursday, September 18 ANC visited Moorestown and took home a 5-0 win. Cooper opened the scoring in the 14th minute with an assist from King. Scott Simons then added a goal off the keeper's hands four minutes later. The score remained 2-0 until the 58th minute when Anders Hyatt hit a far post shot from the right side. Cooper added is second goal of the game 7 minutes later and King closed out the scoring in the 76th minute with an assist from Owen Asplundh. Collin Cooper recorded 7 saves for the shutout. On Friday the 19th Westtown again posted a home-field shutout, this time over Germantown, 2-0. Dewan scored both goals, the first in the 11th minute and the second with an assist from freshman Andrew McCord in the 35th minute. Ramos again was in goal for the hosts. Friends' Central and George opened their league season on Tuesday, September 23 at George and the Phoenix came home with a well-earned 1-0 decision. In a game of two very different halves, George dominated the first half, but failed to score, and then the visitors took over and netted a 55th minute goal from Dan Silver, assisted by Mike Martino. Ross Crauderueff had 9 saves for the shutout. The win was the first for Friends' Central over George since Since September 28, 1989, which was also the last time the Cougars lost a regular-season home FSL game.

WESTTOWN REMANS UNDEFEATED; GEORGE WINS IN OT

On Friday, September 26 Abington hosted Moorestown and jumped out to an early 3-0 lead on the way to a 6-2 win. The 'roos were up 3-0 within 30 minutes and led 4 -1 at the half. Senior Mickey Hutchins and sophomore Dan Dratch each tallied twice and sophomores Dan Kollros and Mike Ellis each scored once for the hosts. Sophomore Jackim Wright netted both goals for Moorestown with assists coming from classmate Jerry Appleton and Lamont Elliot. Abington had two assists from senior Ramsey Haig and one from freshman Colin Ellis. On the same day, Germantown visited Friends Select and came home with a 5-0 win. The Tigers, who led 4-0 at the half, were paced by senior Drew Magaziner with a hat trick. Other goal scorers for the visitors were senior Sam Slaughter and sophomore Dan Schwartzman. Schwartzman also added two assists. Seniors Luke Shechtman and Seth Garz and sophomore Jessie Silverstein each contributed one assist. Sophomore Matt Davis and senior Jake Schulz shared the shutout in goal. On Tuesday, September 30 George visited Germantown and returned home with a 2-1 overtime win. After the Tigers had missed two golden opportunities from inside the six, the Cougars opened the scoring in the 33rd minute on a goal off a scramble by junior Carl Anderson. A corner kick from junior Matt Lilienfeld and a failed clearance by Germantown preceded the goal. Tiger captain Magaziner evened the score in the 45th minute on a solo effort. The score remained knotted through regulation and 9 minutes into the second 10-minute overtime when Germantown was whistled for a hand ball in the area. Lilienfeld scored from the penalty spot and then George held off two strong Tiger attacks in the final minute to gain the win. On Wednesday, October 1 Moorestown hosted Friends Select and scored twice in each half for their first FSL win of the season. Sophomore Eric Saver opened the scoring for the Foxes in the 25th minute with an assist from Appleton. Just seconds before halftime freshman Eric Lundein scored off an Adam Briggs corner kick. Freshman Matt Cutler scored in the 62nd minute and Wright finished off the scoring in the 65th minute, both goals came off Appleton assists. Peter Dempsey made eight saves to maintain the shutout. On Friday, October 3 Westtown blanked visiting Moorestown 5-0. Adam Dewan contributed three goals and an assist to the winning effort. The senior scored in the 9th, 54th and 59th minutes, assisted by juniors Mike Lawson and Matt Rankin on the first and third scores respectively. Junior Paul Lehmann scored on a header with an assist from Dewan in the 63rd minute. The final tally came from junior Adam Thurtell with an assist from classmate Nelson Ramos in the 72nd minute. Ramos and senior Matt Webb shared the

shutout in goal. On Saturday, October 4 Germantown edged Abington 1-0 on the strength of a goal from senior Andy Vick in the 38th minute and the shutout keeping of Matt Davis (7 saves). Davis stopped a penalty kick and the rebound was cleared up field to Magaziner who fed Vick who outjumped the keeper and nodded the ball into the net. Haig played a very strong all-around game for the 'roos, who also benefited from a spectacular save by their keeper on a shot by Magaziner.

WESTTOWN STILL UNDEFEATED; GEORGE, GFS, ANC KEEP PACE

On Tuesday, October 7 host George School had seven different players score goals in a 9-0 win over Friends Select. Senior Adam Decker and junior Chad Kallen led the way with 2 goals each. Junior Carl Anderson contributed three assists. Senior Arion Polkinghorne and Anderson shared the netminding duties in the game which saw the Cougars ahead 4-0 at half-time. Also on the 7th, visiting Germantown downed ANC 3-0. Senior Andy Vick tallied twice in the first half; on a breakaway in the 17th minute with an assist from senior Drew Magaziner and again in the 39th minute on an unassisted score. Magaziner closed out the scoring with an unassisted goal in the 75th minute. Sophomore Matt Davis had 8 saves for the shutout for the Tigers. Again on the 7th visiting Abington topped Friends' Central 3-2. The Phoenix opened the scoring in the 10th minute on a goal by senior Walter Richards. Abington came back to take a 2-1 lead at halftime on goals by sophomore Dan Dratch, assisted by senior Ramsey Haig and then by Haig unassisted. Junior Jared Fertman tied the score with a goal early in the second half assisted by senior Andv Kim. Senior Mickey Hutchins netted the game-winner with about 15 minutes remaining after a corner kick had been stopped by teammate Rafael Fuenzalida, a junior. Freshman keeper Tom Arnold had two big saves to keep the 'roos in the lead in the final 15 minutes. On Thursday, October 9 the Phoenix travelled to Westtown and lost again 3-2 in a remarkably similar game. The visitors opened the scoring on a 12th minute goal by Fertman, unassisted after a loose ball. Westtown tied the score in the 42nd minute on the first of three goals by senior Adam Dewan. Senior Paul Heller had the assist. Friends' Central jumped right back into the lead with a 44th minute goal on an indirect kick by junior Ted Vermeychuk with an assist from Fertman. Dewan tallied on a ball from junior Paul Lehmann in the 59th minute to retie the score and then put home the game-winner in the 78th minute with an assist from junior Nelson Ramos. On Friday, October 10 host George School blanked Academy of the New Church 2-0. Senior Carlos Smith scored both goals unassisted, the first on a direct kick from 22 yards out in the 29th minute, and then on a one on one in the 79th minute. In the 70th minute Cougar senior keeper Arion Polkinghorne made a gamesaving stop on a breakaway by Sean King. On Tuesday, October 14th, the Lions rebounded to hand visiting Friends' Central their third tough 3-2 defeat in a week. King opened the scoring for the hosts in the 7th minute on a through ball from Scott Simons. King netted his second goal in the 22nd minute with an assist from David Keith for a 2-0 halftime lead. The Phoenix came roaring back with goals in the 45th minute on a penalty kick by Kim, and then in the

62nd minute on an individual effort by Jack Suss. Simons, however, netted the game-winner just two minutes later on a 25-yarder to the far post. Goalie Collin Cooper took over for the Lions at that point and made a couple of gamesaving diving stops to preserve the win.

GERMANTOWN RETAINS TITLE ON PENALTY KICKS

In a championship game which symbolized the even play in the league, Germantown Friends won the league title as the result of a 4-3 penalty kick shootout win after 110 minutes of scoreless, but thrilling soccer. The game played on Tuesday, November 4th at Westtown in front of a large, noisy and very appreciative crowd of supporters from both schools was a splendid example of high quality, hard-played soccer. Both teams had chances during regulation in a contest which could best be described as providing constant end-to-end action. Westtown's senior keeper, Nelson Ramos made two spectacular saves, one in each half to keep his team in the game. Germantown forwards Drew Magaziner and Andy Vick each seemed to have sure goals before Ramos slammed the door. Westtown midfielders Paul Lehmann and Paul Heller also had good chances, including a 40+ yarder which clanked off the crossbar. Westtown had 19 shots, 16 of which needed to be saved by Tiger sophomore keeper, Matt Davis, and a number of other chances which were stifled by the GFS fullback contingent. The Tigers took 20 shots, 10 of which were saved by Ramos. Each team earned six corner kicks. The 30 minutes of overtime provided great excitement, a few chances, and, as before, no goals.

Westtown's first and third penalty kicks were initially saved by Davis, but the momentum of each shot carried it just across the line before he could knock it away finally. Their second shot was high, their fourth was saved and their final shot was scored cleanly. Germantown scored on each of their first three kicks, before Ramos stopped the fourth to force the Tigers to win on their final shot of the round of five kicks.

The championship was the second in a row for the Tigers, and the first championship ever to be decided by penalty kicks. The only other playoff game to be decided by penalty kicks was a 1985 semifinal between Friends' Central and Friends Select. For the second year in a row GFS yielded no goals in the playoffs and became the only team besides George School to win back-to-back titles. Magaziner scored 23 goals (10 in FSL play), the second highest season total ever for a Tiger player.

Both semifinal games remained scoreless for most of regulation time and were evenly played. The two 1-0 results, along with the need for a playoff qualifier and

eleven regular-season games decided by one goal, also indicated the balance in the FSL this year. In the 1 v. 4 game at George School the visiting Tigers had the better of the play for much of the game, but this did not translate into many more scoring chances than the Cougars had. Both keepers were tested a couple of times through the first 65 minutes. In the 67th minute a George defender was whistled for a hand ball in the area and Magaziner made no mistake on the resulting penalty kick. The Cougars came back strong and had some of their most dangerous chances in the last five minutes of the game as they moved ten players forward in an attempt to equalize. Davis had five saves for the shutout. In the 2 v. 3 game at Westtown neither the hosts nor ANC could score until the 78th minute when Matt Rankin took a free kick and Paul Lehmann headed the ball inside the near post. Ramos had three saves for the shutout.

In games leading up to the playoffs, on Friday, October 17 George School travelled to Moorestown and had much the better of the play through most of the game, but needed a goal in the 4th minute of the second overtime to beat the hosts 1-0. The Cougars, who outshot the Foxes 27-9, missed a penalty kick with eight minutes left in regulation and then had to rely on a brilliant save by senior Arion Polkinghorne against Jackiem Wright to send the game into overtime. Carlos Smith netted the only goal with assists from Terry Lee and Adam Decker. Polkinghorne made only four saves, but one of them made the difference. Also on the 17th, Friends' Central hosted Friends Select and notched a 2-1 win. Junior Jack Suss opened the scoring for the Phoenix with a 12th minute goal assisted by sophomore Tyler Van Gundy. Senior Walter Richards put the hosts up 2-0 early in the second half with an assist from junior Mike Martino. Junior Eric Siu netted the Falcons' first league goal in the 76th minute off a scramble, but despite some good final minute chances, they could not even the score. Finally, on the 17th, in a contentious game marred by three red cards, visiting Westtown beat Abington 2-1. Westtown missed a penalty kick about 20 minutes into the game but scored shortly thereafter as a direct kick by Rankin was knocked in by Lehmann. The 'roos evened the score with about 10 minutes left in the half on a goal by Mike Ellis with an assist from Andy Heinrich. In a seesaw second half the visitors emerged victorious when Abington put in an own goal with about 15 minutes remaining. On Tuesday, October 21 host Germantown waited to score until the second half, and then pumped in five goals in a shutout win over Moorestown. Magaziner scored his first of four goals less than 30 seconds into the second half. Senior Andy Vick tallied the other goal for the Tigers. Assists came from Ben Greenfield, Sean Weinstein, Vick and Dan Schwartzman. Davis made 3 saves for the shutout. Also on the 21st, host ANC blanked Friends Select 6-0 behind four goals from senior Sean King. The Lions jumped to a 3-0 lead in the first three minutes of the game. Robin Cooper and Jordan Walter netted goals for the winners and Walter, David Keith and Mike Thomas had assists. Collin Cooper had 6 saves for the shutout.

On Friday, October 24, in a game featuring mostly defensive play, host George School moved into first place with a 2-0 win over Westtown. In the 17th minute senior David Peasley headed in a corner kick from classmate Ken Taga. Dewan was hurt early in the second half, limiting Westtown's offensive output, and shortly thereafter in the 54th minute Decker knocked in a ball from junior Matt Lilienfeld and Peasley. Polkinghorne made a brilliant save in the 75th minute to keep the shutout intact. Also on the 24th, Friends' Central kept their playoff hopes alive with a 5-1 road win at Moorestown. The Phoenix had two goals from senior Andy Kim and one each from Martino and sophomores Jeff Dean and Zach Driscoll. Five different players contributed assists (freshman Ryan Tozer, juniors Jared Fertman, Darryl Yorkman and Ted Vermeychuck, and senior Dan Silver.) Moorestown's lone goal came from Matt Cutler with an assist from Lamont Elliot. In the final game on the 24th Abington Friends took home a win at Frineds Select, 4-1. Senior Mickey Hutchins netted a hat trick and Mike Ellis added a goal for the 'roos, who were up 3-1 at the half. Dan Dratch had two assists and Colin Ellis one for the winners. Joe Bernstein had the Falcon's lone goal.

On Tuesday, October 28 host Friends' Central used a goal by Richards in about the 15th minute to defeat visiting Germantown 1-0 and force a three-way tie for third, fourth and fifth places. Germantown was drawn for fourth place and Friends' Central and Academy of the New Church played on October 29th to determine third place.
